

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, July 17, 1946 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on July 3, 1946 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Mr. Stanley Duvall addressed the Board in regard to the two west-bound trains which leave Riverhead about 9:50 P.M. and 9:25 P.M. on Sunday evenings during the summer months. He stated that when they arrive, they are already so crowded, that there is little or no seating capacity in the cars for the passengers who wish to use the service from Riverhead. He said that it is a deplorable situation and that it is not only detrimental to the safety and convenience of the people who come out for the week-ends but also to the Town of Riverhead. He strongly urged the Board to request the Long Island Rail Road Co. to add adequate passenger cars to the above trains in order to relieve this over crowded condition.

Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaleski

WHEREAS, it has been called to the attention of the Town Board of Riverhead that the two westbound trains leaving Riverhead at 5:50 P.M. and 9:25 P.M. on Sunday evenings during the months of July and August are crowded upon arrival at Riverhead, thus leaving little or no seating capacity for the large number of passengers from Riverhead wishing to use this service, and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of this Board, this condition is not only detrimental to the safety and convenience of the passengers, but also to the Long Island Rail Road and the Town of Riverhead, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead most urgently requests the Long Island Rail Road Company to make a thorough survey of this situation to the end that adequate passenger cars are added to the above trains in order to relieve this over crowded condition. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from William L. Fleischman tendering his resignation as Police Patrolman of the Town of Riverhead, effective as of July 23, 1946. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the resignation of William L. Fleischman be and the

same is hereby accepted, to become effective July 23, 1946. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A statement of the vote cast at the annual budget election of the Riverhead Fire District held on Tuesday, July 9, 1946, was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

The Supervisor's report for the month of June 1946 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that Robert P. O'Beirne be appointed Life Guard at the Town Beach at Wading River, beginning as of July 6, 1946 and ending Labor Day, inclusive, hours from 11:30 A.M. to 6:30 P.M. each day, salary fixed at the rate of \$40.00 per week. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that Norman J. Bruen be and he hereby is appointed attendance Supervisor for School Districts Nos. 1,2,3,4,12 and 13 in the Town of Riverhead, and be it further

Resolved, that Howard A. Wells be and he hereby is appointed attendance Supervisor for School Districts Nos. 8,9,10 and 11 in the Town of Riverhead, and be it further

Resolved, that their compensation be fixed at the rate of \$250.00 per school year each, payable in ten monthly payments, which compensation shall include all expenses other than those incurred when attending meetings outside of the Town of Riverhead, called by the District Superintendent of Schools, at which time actual expenses are to be paid by the Town of Riverhead. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date.

There being no further business an motion and vote the meeting adjourn to meet on Wednesday, August 7, 1946 at 2:00 P.M.
