

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the
Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office, on Wednesday,
October 29, 1930 at 2 P.M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways
was present.

The minutes of the meeting of the Board held on
October 15, 1930 were read and on motion and vote duly
adopted.

A communication received from F.T. Emmons of Wading
River advising that there was no guard rail at the polling
place in the First Election District was read and Justice
Miller was appointed a committee to have a rail installed.

The resignation of John Fafinski as Justice of the
Peace was received, effective as of November 1, 1930.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was
Resolved That the resignation of John Fafinski, Justice of
the Peace of the Town of Riverhead, effective as of November
1, 1930 be and the same is hereby accepted with regret and
that said resignation be placed on file.

A communication was read received from the War
Department, New York City, advising that an application
had been received from the Ravatone Realty Corporation of
5 Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay, N.Y. requesting permission from
the War Department to dredge in Great Peconic Bay at Laurel,
N.Y. to a depth of eight feet below mean low water and advising
that November 3, 1930 was the limiting date for receipt of
protest.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was
Resolved That Supervisor Homan be authorized to appear before
the War Department, 39 Whitehall Street, New York City at
the expense of the Town of Riverhead, to examine the proposed
dredging of the Ravatone Realty Corporation and look out for
the interest of the Town of Riverhead.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificate of indebtedness, the sum of Twenty Seven Hundred Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of October 28, 1930.

Joseph F. Clemente, representative of the Fyr Fyter Company, addressed the Board relative to installing fire extinguishes in the Town Offices.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Town of Riverhead purchase two one quart Fyr Fyter fire extniguishes at a price of \$14.00 each.

Charles O. Downs and Justice Miller advised that they had inspected the altered highway at Wading River known as the North Side Road and recommended that said highway be accepted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That this Board hereby consents that the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead, make an order altering the highway described in the application of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn, N.Y. pursuant to Section 190 of the Highway Law.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways, advised the Board that he desired to replace the two dump trucks belonging to the Town with International 1 Ton Dump trucks/ The Board was addressed by Mr. L.Y. Robinson, local representative of the International Truck and Mr. Smith, a representative from the factory of the Company. It was decided to hold this matter over until after the budget had been approved.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Board adjourned to reconvene on Friday October 31, 1930 following the public hearing on the Budget.
