

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Office on Wednesday, December 24, 1930 at 2 P. M.

Charles O. Downs, Town Superintendent of Highways was present.

The minutes of the Meeting of the Town Board held December 10, 1930 were read and on motion and vote adopted.

A petition for a street light in the South Jamesport Lighting District in front of the Post Office was presented and the Lighting Committee recommended that the request be granted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Petition for a street light in the South Jamesport Lighting District be granted and that the Lighting Company be requested to install one 80 C.P. street light on Second Street, South Jamesport in front of the Post Office.

A communication received from Sam Alper of 27 South 4th Avenue, New Brunswick, N.J., advising that the water draining from the Road bordering his property at the corner of Railroad Street and Osborn Avenue was damaging said property, was read and ordered placed on file.

A petition signed by tax payers of the Wading River Lighting District requesting that the street lights be extended to the residence of Theodore Worona was presented and referred to a committee consisting of Justice Miller and Justice Conklin for investigation.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Supervisor and the Town Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to borrow upon certificate of indebtedness, the sum of One Thousand Dollars to pay on account of audited bills of December 23, 1930.

The committee consisting of Justice Miller and Justice Frederick, appointed to examine the Petition to the Town Board, calling for an election to establish a police district reported as follows:

Total valuation of contemplated district	\$6,363,347.00
Necessary valuation of police district-51%-	3,245,306.97
Valuation on petition	3,651,070.00

The petition has \$405,763.03 of valuation over the necessary 51% required.

Supervisor Homan advised that if the new contemplated town laws go into effect, this would do away with all commissions including police commissioners and the police matter would then be under the supervision of the Town Board.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried it was Resolved That the Town Board employ Attorney J. Harry Saxstien to examine the petition and also look into the section of the proposed new town law relative to police districts and police commissioners.

There being no further business, on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on January 14, 1931 at 2 P. M.
