

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Clerk's office, Wednesday June 11th, 1924 at 2-00 P.M.

Minutes of previous meeting read and on motion adopted.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that a flash signal be purchased to be placed at the abutment of East Lane and Main Road at Jamesport and that Justice Penny be appointed a committee of one to contract for the same.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the matter of purchasing and installing signs for traffic regulation be referred to Justices Corwin and Vail the committee appointed to draft traffic regulations and that said committee be continued with full power to act in the purchase and placing of all necessary signs.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was RESOLVED, that the U.S. Standard Voting Machine Be, and the same hereby is, adopted for use at elections held in this Town; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor and the Town Clerk, or either of them, be, and they hereby are, authorized, empowered, and directed to enter into a contract with the Automatic Registering Machine Co., for the purchase of Seven (7) U.S. Standard Voting Machines of the 9 Row, 30 column size at the net price of Nine Hundred Forty Dollars (\$940) each, f.o.b. care Jamestown, N.Y; and be it further

RESOLVED, that in payment for said voting machines, the Supervisor is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed, upon receipt of said machines, to pay to the Automatic Registering Machine Co., Inc., the sum of Sixty Five Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$ 6580.00)

On motion duly made seconded and carried the Supervisor and Town Clerk were designated as a committee to consult with the banks of this Town for the purpose of ascertaining

the proper plan of payment upon the purchase of the said voting machines, for the best interest of the town.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Supervisor appoint a committee to confer with the Board of Education and the Fire Department relative to the use of Public building under their supervision as polling places for the coming election.

Mr. Seldon Heatley addressed the board with relation to the establishment by the town of comfort stations and regulations to prevent the throwing of rubbish on the beach at Wading River.

On motion duly made seconded and carried it was resolved that the Supervisor and Town Clerk be, and they hereby are authorized and empowered to borrow the sum of Five hundred and fifty dollars (\$550) in anticipation of taxes, to the credit of the Riverhead Water District, for the purpose of meeting interest payments due June 1st 1924. upon Water District Bonds.

The Committee appointed to inspect the condition of the flag pole at Peconic Avenue and Main Street reported that both the topmast and mainmast are weak and unsafe.

On motion duly made seconded and carried the board adjourned to meet at the Town office on June 26th, 1924 at 7-30 P.M.
