RECEIVER OF TAXES - Irene J. Pendzick

Mrs. Pendzick stated that tickets are still available for the Bicentennial Ball on April 3rd and anyone interested in attending should contact the Bicentennial Committee.

She further stated that she has received word from Grumman that the time capsule is ready and will be delivered tomorrow for the Committee to look at and the Tomorrow's World Club, a Social Studies Club of Riverhead High School will administer the program concerning the contents of the capsule.

Supervisor Smith spoke on a resolution to be presented later in the evening regarding Cablevision rates and further stated that all the data concerning the application was filed in the Town Clerk's Office and could be reviewed by any interested party, during normal business hours.

He then spoke of a request by the V.F.W. for the Town Board to participate in the Memorial Day Parade on May 31st and further stated that all will attend.

Supervisor Smith then said that he may have to leave the Meeting early, in order to attend a hearing at the County Center with reference to the Farmland Acquisition Program.

Councilman Menendez offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

WHEREAS, The County of Suffolk has prepared a Farmland Acquisition Program and has solicited participation therein, and

WHEREAS, The County has received offers of many parcels of farmland within the Town of Riverhead, and

RESOLUTION - continued:

WHEREAS, This Town Board is desirous of preserving farmland and open space and recognizes the County Program as a means of achieving this goal, and

WHEREAS, The County Legislature is currently considering action to acquire several parcels within the Town of Riverhead,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this Board does hereby encourage the County Legislature to take those steps necessary to effectuate this first step in implementation of the Suffolk County Farmland Acquisition Program with all deliberate speed.

The vote, Councilman Lombardi, Yes, Councilwoman Tomlinson, Yes, Councilman Menendez, Yes, Councilman Young, Yes, and Supervisor Smith, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supervisor Smith then noted that he had received a letter of resignation from Gary Pace, the Town Historian and further stated that everyone there knew of Gary's good work and regretted the fact that the pressures of his job would prevent him from continuing his good work during the Bicentennial Year.

He then called attention to two maps set up in the Meeting Room and spoke as follows: "I can't see the dates from here, but I believe the first is dated March 5th and the second is dated March 15th. The latter is on top.

As you may recall from the last Meeting, the Town Board has proposed, in the Article VII Proceedings, which deals with the location of the transmission lines, a route alternate to that proposed by LILCO. During that week that we filed that application, our Attorney from New York City, traveled to Albany and then out here to work with us. The proposal for the Calverton to Wading River segment of this line, which as you recall as proposed by LILCO is an overhead route and as proposed by the Town of Riverhead as an underground route, appears to be unnecessary for the capacities of Jamesport 1 & 2. The Town Board therefore is going to file with the Public Service Commission and request their consideration of the elimination of the Calverton to Wading River segment as being unnecessary for the operation of plants 1 & 2 and that the substation be moved from the site that is now proposed at Twomey Avenue, to an area known as the old "gas stone" on the south side of the river and that the exit from that point continue along through the pine barrens on the south side of the river to a point where it reaches the Long Island Expressway and the now proposed routes of the Long Island Lighting Company.

We are concerned, not only with the segment from Calverton to Jamesport, but also with the Calverton to Wading River and the areas that are contacted thereby and if there is no need or justification for that line for Jamesport's 1 & 2, then we are going to argue that this particular area of our Town should not be interdicted by this particular line."

He then stated that anyone who wished to examine the maps, could do so.

He then spoke as follows: "On Thursday, last, Riverhead obtained a "Show Cause Order" from Mr. Justice Bracken, Supreme Court, Suffolk County, containing therein an injunction against any motorcycle rally activity in the Town of Riverhead by the Long Island Motor Cross Association, pending a hearing before the Justice sitting in Special Term, Part I, on March 22nd, so those of you that may be "

"here wondering about what we've done since last Friday's Meeting, that's the answer on that."

He then spoke of the Public Hearing on the Noise Ordinance No. 45, scheduled for 7:45 P.M. on March 23rd, 1976.

Supervisor Smith asked Edward Munson if he recalled whether or not they had passed a provision making extensions by Special Permit only.

Mr. Munson stated that he had no recollection of such a provision.

The matter was then deferred until the next Town Board Meeting.

b) Ten (10) signatures requesting "No Parking Zone" be created in Shopping Center in front of ALL stores.

Supervisor Smith: "I don't wish to give the impression that I am ignoring this problem. I believe that the owner, Paul Slayton - Riverhead Associates, is about to come forward under the Special Permit Provision recently adopted and I think this is a matter that we will take up with him at that time.

I wish the store owners would be as diligent in getting the owner of the Shopping Center to comply with the promises that he made to the prior Town Board, as they seem to be in requesting us to do something for them."

COMMUNICATIONS

Mary E. Gloss, dated 3/4/76, extension of letter dated Feb. 20, 1976, requesting street lights on Linda Avenue, submitting five (5) signatures of taxpayers that request lights on Linda Avenue (600') to Route 25. Giving LILCO Pole Numbers 6,5,4,3,1 and 1 and stating that three lights will suffice. Filed.

N.Y.S. Dept. of Environmental Conservation, dated 3/9/76, relating to Long Island Well Application No. W-3063 of the Town of Riverhead. Giving notice that there will be a Public Hearing held in Bldg. 40, S.U.N.Y. Campus, Stony Brook, N.Y., on the 19th day of April, 1976, at 10:00 A.M., to hear all persons who wish to be heard either in favor or opposed to the plans of the petitioner to install a temporary well point system to lower the groundwater level during construction of sanitary sewer pump station on the east side of Ostrander Avenue, north of Elton Street, Riverhead. The estimated drawdown of static water level is 15 feet. The average daily pumpage will be 2.0 million gallons for a period of 30 days. All the water pumped will be discharged into a nearby Town drainage system which drains to Sawmill Creek and then to the Peconic River. Notices of any person desiring to be heard must be filed in writing and in duplicate on or before the 9th day of April, 1976, and objections so filed must particularly specify the grounds thereof. In the event that no notice of appearance is filed within the time specified, the Department will dispense with the Public Hearing. Filed.

Riverhead Chamber of Commerce, dated 3/15/76, stating that a group of people interested in beautifying Riverhead have formulated a program to plant pin oak trees along Main Street where needed, from Osborne Avenue to the Town Hall, Peconic Avenue and Roanoke Avenue. The planting of shrubs along the Peconic River is to be the high point of the program and an exhilaration of the plantings might very well include other Town properties such as Route 58.

The Community Environmental Committee is considering an endorsement of a program to raise the funds needed for the trees and shrubs, through a Memorial Plantings Fund.

The expense of the trees and shrubs are to be absorbed by the Memorial Plantings Fund. The plantings will be done by members of the Community, Service Clubs, etc., in a united one or two day civic donation of time and labor. There may be need for Town equipment to drill the holes. Mr. Horton has agreed to cooperate with the program at the March 2nd Town Board Meeting.

The Committee respectfully requests of the Town Board, approval for: 1) the planting of the pin oak trees and 2) the use of the highway equipment to drill the holes. Filed.

COMMUNICATIONS - continued:

Supervisor Smith spoke on the Memorial Fund and encouraged anyone thinking of participating in the program to please do so.

He further stated that donating an oak tree in memory of a loved one was a fine idea.

Ed Munson stated that the V.F.W. was responsible for putting the flags along Main Street and requested the Supervisor to take the placing of the flags into consideration, when they plant the trees.

Supervisor Smith then stated that with reference to the Building Department and the Water and Sewer Departments, the N.Y. Telephone Co. has given them the undertaking that they promised some months ago.

He then stated that if either of the Departments wished to review it, they could come in tomorrow and see either the Town Attorney or himself.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

a) Codification - Progress

b) G.L. Schmelzer - Special Permit for Mobile Home Park -

Supervisor Smith stated that this application requires consideration in light of the clause adopted by the prior Town Board with reference to the Wittmeier settlement.

c) Donald and Joan Shwonik - Special Permit for Single-Family Residence, Wading River - Supervisor Smith stated that this matter would be taken care of tonight.

d) Tabled Resolution re Town Crier Project for Wading River - Supervisor Smith stated that this matter would be taken care of tonight.

e) Fire District Request for Fire Zone in Shopping Center - Supervisor Smith stated that this matter would be taken care of when Mr. Slayton came before the Board, at a later date.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Supervisor Smith asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Dr. Alfred Smith spoke on the landing platform at Iron Pier Beach stating that it has always been a problem and he would appreciate it if work on it could be started early this year.

Paul Meyer asked why there was no clock on the wall and where the name plates were of the Board Members, so people knew who they were talking to.

He then spoke on the hunting in the hamlet of Riverhead and complained about the hunters shooting too close to his home and others in his neighborhood.

He continued by asking about the possibility of adopting a hunting ordinance, prohibiting hunting in the hamlet of Riverhead before the advent of the next hunting season.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES - continued:

Supervisor Smith spoke of other sections of Town that are having problems with hunters and further stated that he has requested the Riverhead Sportsman's Club to post signs on the properties and police them, to try and cut down on the complaints.

Discussion followed.

William Kasperovich spoke of a situation that occurred that afternoon in Wading River, where someone brought in a prefabricated building with total and flagrant disregard of Zoning and Building Laws.

He then stated that there had been a Stop Work Order had been posted on Friday and the Police were on the scene today.

He continued by saying that in spite of the Stop Work Order and the appearance of the Police on the scene, the work continued.

He concluded by saying that he felt it was time the Town Board took a stand and set a precedent and not let the Zoning and Building Regulations be thrown to the wind.

Supervisor Smith asked Ray Wiwczar if he issued a violation.

Mr. Wiwczar stated that he issued two violations, two weeks ago, but the woman who owned the property, just returned from Florida yesterday and he'll meet with her tomorrow on this matter.

Supervisor Smith asked if any permits had been obtained.

Mr. Wiwczar replied that none had been issued, so far.

Supervisor Smith stated that Monday, a Meeting was held with the Citizens Group from the Jamesport School and in light of their discussion, a contract would be executed for the installation of heating facilities within the Jamesport School.

He then spoke about the Town's intervention in the Article VII Hearings and the establishment of a fund to finance the prosecution proceedings.

He further stated that they would have to have a resolution authorizing the \$25,000.00 from Federal Revenue to pay the prosecution costs.

He then spoke of a letter received from Appraisers who appraised the County Farmland Acquisition Program, who have offered to testify on the Town's behalf in the Article VII proceedings at a cost of \$250 per diem and \$4,200 for compilation and development of material and information on the farmland acquisition vs transmission lines.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Menendez.

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead has chosen to present an affirmative case in the matter of the proposed LILCO 345KV power line, and

WHEREAS, It would be beneficial to develop information, materials and testimony concerning the damage that the construction of the line over LILCO'S proposed route would cause to the agricultural lands through which the lines would pass,

RESOLUTION - continued:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That North East Appraisals and Management Co., Inc., be hired at the following cost:

\$4,200 for development of material and information, in addition to \$250 plus necessary expenses per individual testifying at hearings.

The vote, Councilman Lombardi, Yes, Councilwoman Tomlinson, Yes, Councilman Menendez, Yes, Councilman Young, Yes, and Supervisor Smith, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supervisor Smith then stated: "There has been a matter that has been of great concern to myself and I'm sure to others, that has been on-going for some weeks, in the Town. It deals with the Open House Program and the administration thereof by Rev. Adinolfi.

The problem posed is made moot by the fact that Rev. Adinolfi has tendered his resignation as Director of the Program, effective April 1st.

We have refined the problem between Rev. Adinolfi and myself to a statement attributed to myself as follows: 'I have the distinct impression that Rev. Adinolfi is ripping off this program.' In the hope that the problem is solved and that we can put this particular matter behind us. I would withdraw that statement and suggest to everyone, that no matter what I discovered or what I was working on in the program with reference to its administration, that it is exactly that - a moot problem and we should all let it pass. I hope that that meets with everyone's acceptance. End of story."

Supervisor Smith then recessed the Meeting at 8:20 P.M. and left the Meeting to attend the Farmlands Acquisition Hearings at the County Legislature.

Temporary Chairman George G. Young re-opened the Meeting at 8:30 P.M. and proceeded with resolutions.

RESOLUTIONS

Councilwoman Tomlinson offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Lombardi.

WHEREAS, The Knights of Columbus have graciously offered to donate their time, effort and expense to the construction and location of a "Town Crier" to serve the needs of the Wading River hamlet, and

WHEREAS, The proposed location of said "Town Crier", is on an area of great natural beauty, as evidenced by a viewing of said site, and

WHEREAS, The Town of Riverhead's uses of the proposed site are restricted to park purposes, and

WHEREAS, It is the opinion of this Town Board that the interests of the Town would best be served by preserving the natural beauty of the proposed site, by prohibiting the erection of any type of construction on said site, and

RESOLUTION - continued:

WHEREAS, The Town Board endorses the idea of the proposed erection of a "Town Crier" as designed in the proposed donation from the Knights of Columbus.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That regretfully, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead opposes the erection of the proposed "Town Crier" or any other construction on the proposed site.

The vote, Councilman Lombardi, Yes, Councilwoman Tomlinson, Yes, Councilman Menendez, Yes, Councilman Young, Yes, and Supervisor Smith, Absent.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Temporary Chairman George G. Young explained that the Board met with Mr. Brandeburg, last Friday and discussed this issue with him and came up with a tentative idea of erecting the Town Crier in the southwest corner of the parking field.

The vote, Councilman Lombardi, Yes, Councilwoman Tomlinson, Yes, Councilman Menendez, Yes, Councilman Young, Yes, and Supervisor Smith, Absent.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Attorney Peter S. Danowski, Jr. stated that the letter from the Chamber of Commerce also spoke of planting shrubs along Route 58 and he felt the Town Board should tell Mr. Horton not to drill holes for plantings on Route 58.

Councilman Menendez offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the Town Attorney prepare an ordinance or local law compatible with those of the other East End Towns and reciprocal with the same providing for the licensing of contractors, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That upon completion of the drafts of said ordinance or local law, the Town Clerk be and she hereby is authorized to publish and post a notice of public hearing thereon.

The vote, Councilman Lombardi, Yes, Councilwoman Tomlinson, Yes, Councilman Menendez, Yes, Councilman Young, Yes, and Supervisor Smith, Absent.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Lombardi offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilwoman Tomlinson.

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead has been informed that a machine at the Riverhead Town Dump has been rendered inoperable by the destruction of a tire, and

WHEREAS, The cost of a suitable replacement tire matching the other tires currently on the machine, coupled with service charges, totals Two Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-Eight Dollars and Thirty Cents (\$2,238.30), and

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead is of the opinion that a public emergency exists arising out of the unforeseen condition concerning said tire, within the meaning of Section 103, Subdivision (4) of the General Municipal Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the aforementioned tire be purchased for the total cost, including service charge of \$2,238.30.

The vote, Councilman Lombardi, Yes, Councilwoman Tomlinson, Yes, Councilman Menendez, Yes, Councilman Young, Yes, and Supervisor Smith, Absent.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Temporary Chairman George G. Young recessed the Meeting in order to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 8:45 P.M.

The Town Clerk submitted affidavits of posting and publishing Public Notice relating to application of Donald and Joan Shwonik in connection with the proposed Subdivision and Platting of Land at Parker Road, Wading River, New York for a Special Permit for erecting a single family dwelling pursuant to Town Ordinance No. 26. The affidavits were ordered filed.

Temporary Chairman Young declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to heard.

No one wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, the Hearing was closed at 8:46 P.M. and Temporary Chairman Young re-opened the Meeting.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Menendez.

WHEREAS, A Public Hearing was held on March 16, 1976, to hear all those persons interested in the application of Donald and Joan Shwonik to erect a one-family residence in an Industrial Zone and all other matters having been done in conformity with the applicable provisions of Ordinance #26,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance #26 this Board does hereby grant a Special Permit to Donald and Joan Shwonik to erect a one-family residence in accordance with the application, plans and specifications on file with the Town Clerk.

The vote, Councilman Lombardi, Yes, Councilwoman Tomlinson, Yes, Councilman Menendez, Yes, Councilman Young, Yes, and Supervisor Smith, Absent.

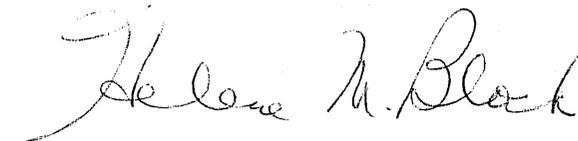
The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.
