

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on Tuesday, November 20, 1979 at 7:30 P.M.

Supervisor Smith called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M., and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Supervisor Smith: "Ladies and gentlemen, if I can, before we start tonight's meeting, as my family and I sat down to eat supper tonight, it was the news of the events in Iran wherein young men and women whose only crime is being Americans are threatened by something called Islamic justice. We have some people in our community who work for the Grumman Aerospace Corporation, who have been in that nation, and have witnessed Islamic justice, things such as having ones hands chopped off and the other consequences of being in that nation. I do not know that anything we can do here at this particular Town Board Meeting would influence the outcome in Iran, but I would like to suggest for the Board's adoption, a resolution indicating this Board's support of the actions of the President of the United States and the Congress of the United States in standing up to the violations of international law by the current government of Iran supporting the President in his actions to secure the release of the Americans that are held unjustly and generally supporting the people and families of those people who are captives in Iran."

WHEREAS, men and women, whose only crime is being Americans, are threatened by Islamic justice and the events ocuring in Iran, and

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby supports the actions of the President of the United States, and the Congress of the United States in opposing the violations of international law by the current government in Iran, and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the President of the United States has the unqualified support of this Town Board for his actions to secure the release of American hostages that are being held unjustly, and extends support of the Americans held and their families.
