FURTHER RESOLVED, That for the limited purposes of the Tax Receiver's General Receipt Account, the European-American Bank and Peconic Bank are hereby designated as a depository, and for the limited purposes of the Federal Public Works Program and Capital Projects, the Chemical Bank, the Peconic Bank, the Suffolk County National Bank and the North Fork Bank and Trust are hereby designated as depositories, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That (a) all accounts be collateralized subject to the approval of this board with memoranda of agreement that they shall, for the period that they remain the official depositories, bid upon the obligations of the Town of Riverhead and its subordinate districts when the same are offered for sale.

The one that will be considered, will be at 8:15 P.M., will be outside the new doctors offices on Second Street near the Post Office. It will serve a dual service. Provide handicap for anybody who wishes to use the Post Office and also provide space for the doctors patients. Is there anybody wishing to address the Town Board on this ordinance first?"

Supervisor Smith answered: "Said salaries for elected officials, said salaries for Town Employees, said salaries for Water Employees, said salaries for Sewer District Employees, said salaries for the Highway Department and the Police we did."

Supervisor Smith recessed the meeting for seven minutes after which the meeting was recessed to hold a public hearing.

The Town Clerk submitted affidavits of publishing and posting notice of a public hearing regarding proposed amendments to Chapter 101, Vehicles & Traffic, Article IX, on parking permits for handicapped persons specifically for designation of parking places, to be held at Town Hall on January 2, 1979 at 8:15 P.M.

The affidavits were ordered to be placed on file.

Supervisor Smith: "Does anyone want to talk on this one which is the application of the ordinance?"
