WHEREAS, the applicant submitted such required information to the Lead Agency, and

WHEREAS, the Riverhead Town Board considered such supplemental data and the established SEQOR record to form a Final Environmental Impact Statement and accepted the Final Environmental Impact Statement of the subject petition by resolution dated August 15, 1989, and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency has carefully reviewed the SEQOR record to date as well as all other relevant environmental and Town planning information relating to the subject petition;

## State Environmental Quality Review

## FINDINGS STATEMENT

Pursuant to Article 8 (State Environmental Quality Review Act - SEQRA) of the Environmental Conservation Law and 6 NYCRR Part 617, the Riverhead Planning Board, as Lead Agency, makes the following findings:

**Name of Action:** Special Permit petition of Joseph and Linda Sullivan

**Description of Action:** Special Permit to allow the expansion of a preexisting and nonconforming use within the Residential A Zoning Use District in order to expand an existing mobile home park by a total of thirty-two (32) residential units.

**Location:** West side of Wading River-Manorville Road. Approx. 3,300 feet south of State Route 25A, Wading River. (S.C.T.M. 0600-96-1-3)

**Agency Jurisdiction:** Riverhead Town Board

**Date Final Environmental Impact Statement Filed:** August 21, 1989

**Facts and Conclusions in the Final Environmental Impact Statement Relied Upon to Support the Decision:**

First, that the Draft Environmental Impact Statement identified the following relevant environmental issues and impacts with regard to the proposed development:

- (i) Impacts upon terrestrial ecology;
- (ii) Impacts upon groundwater resources;
- (iii) Impacts upon existing transportation networks;
- (iv) Impacts upon growth and character of the community;
- (v) Project integration with the Riverhead Master Plan and attending Zoning Use District Map;

Second, that the Draft Environmental Impact Statement, as accepted by the Town Board, analyzed those environmental impacts as identified by the Lead Agency and provided a description of mitigation measures and project alternatives;

Third, that comments received upon the Draft Environmental Impact Statement from both involved agencies and parties of interest centered upon the following:

- (i) That the Town Board should not consider the petition to be an expansion of a nonconforming use as defined by the Riverhead Town Code;

(ii) That the Town Board should not consider any additional mobile home expansions;

(iii) That the applicant shall provide the Lead Agency with evidence that the proposed residential density of the expansion is in conformance with the regulations of Article 6 of the Suffolk County Sanitary Code;

(iv) That the applicant shall provide the Lead Agency with a description of the proposed buildings and their orientation on the site, together with proposed measures to mitigate the project's impact upon the immediate neighborhood in terms of character and aesthetic resources

Fourth, that the Draft Environmental Impact Statement, together with the applicant's Response to Commentary, forms a description of an action which is not considered suitable for the site and which continues to have a significant impact upon the environment. The facts which support the Findings are:

(i) That the residential density of the proposed mobile home park expansion exceeds that density considered appropriate for the Zone III Deep Recharge Area (without wastewater collection and treatment) as defined by the 208 Wastewater Management Study and regulated by Article 6 of the Suffolk County Sanitary Code;

(ii) That the area of the parcel is not sufficient to support the proposed residential density;

(iii) The proposed project does not conform to the existing character of the community in that it is surrounded by larger lot land subdivisions and open space recreational uses;

(iv) That the number of units to be constructed is not justified in relation to the number of units otherwise proposed within the Wading River Hamlet and approved by the Riverhead Planning Board;

(v) That the number of residential units to be constructed will create a material conflict with the Town of Riverhead's Master Plan as officially adopted by the Riverhead Town Board.

Fifth, that having considered the Draft Environmental Impact Statement and the Final Environmental Impact Statement, and having considered the preceding written facts and conclusions relied upon to meet the requirements of 6 NYCRR Part 617.9, this Statement of Findings certifies that:

(i) The requirements of 6 NYCRR Part 617 have been met;

(ii) Consistent with the social, economic, and other essential considerations from among the reasonable alternatives thereto, the action is one which fails to adequately minimize or avoid adverse environmental effects to the greatest extent practicable.

# 681 RESOLUTION REQUESTING THAT FUNDING IN THE SUFFOLK COUNTY BUDGET BE RESTORED FOR DRUG AND ALCOHOL ABUSE PREVENTION

Councilperson Lombardi offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilperson Civiletti,

WHEREAS, the Riverhead Town Board has been designated as the Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Council for the Town of Riverhead, and

WHEREAS, in its capacity as the Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Council, the Riverhead Town Board has caused a Community Awareness Program (commonly known as "CAP") to be created, and

WHEREAS, CAP is currently operated through a separate not-for-profit corporation known as Riverhead Community Awareness Program, Inc. which has its own Board of Directors which serve as volunteers to the community, and

WHEREAS, CAP operates many programs in the community for the benefit of Riverhead's youth which involve counselling by State certified social workers available to students within the Riverhead School District, one of the programs which is funded through the Suffolk County Youth Bureau, and

WHEREAS, CAP has advised the Riverhead Town Board that funding from the Suffolk County Youth Bureau for counselling services, specifically for the high school social worker who also trains Peer Leaders for the Volunteer Elementary Education program, has been eliminated from the County Executive's proposed budget, which elimination is contrary to the stated policy of the County of Suffolk to counsel and educate our youth so that they are able to avoid reliance on drugs,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Town Board, as the Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Counsel for the Town of Riverhead, hereby calls upon the Suffolk County Executive and the Suffolk County Legislature to restore the funds to the Suffolk County Budget enabling the Suffolk County Youth Bureau to provide a high school social worker to counsel students and train Peer Leaders for the Volunteer Elementary Education Program within our District in order to carry on the vitally important work carried on by the Riverhead Community Awareness Program within the Riverhead School District, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk shall forward certified copies of this resolution to the County Executive, all members of the Suffolk County Legislature, Riverhead Community Awareness Program, the Riverhead School District, the Suffolk County Youth Bureau, Assemblyman Sawicki, Assemblyman Behan, and Senator LaValle.

# 684 OPPOSES ABOLITION OF COUNTY PARK RANGERS

Councilperson Civiletti offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilperson Lombardi.

WHEREAS, there exist over 1,800 acres of passive and active Suffolk County Parkland within the Town of Riverhead; and

WHEREAS, this land is located within either the Peconic River Basin or the Peconic Bay Critical Environmental Area (Indian Island County Parkland) and is considered by the Riverhead Town Board to be environmentally sensitive; and

WHEREAS, County Executive Patrick Halpin has proposed to eliminate the County Park Ranger Corps as a cost-cutting measure in his 1991 budget; and

WHEREAS, Park Rangers are professionally trained, full-time enforcement officers whose oversight and management of the County Parks on a year-round basis is indispensable to the continued preservation and stewardship of this valuable open space preserved for use and benefit of present and future generations; and

WHEREAS, the County Parks Corps is presently at minimum staffing levels having been the subject of previous economy measures and the further elimination of these enforcement personnel will place a severe burden on local police and place the preservation, use and enjoyment of these parks at undue risk to the rising problems of drunkenness, illegal dumping, poaching, woodcutting, rowdiness and illegal drug use; and

Elements of this Plan will include a 55% to 60% reduction/recycling/reuse program involving: waste reduction; materials recycling to be achieved through mandatory source separation; household hazardous waste removal (S.T.O.P. program); yard waste composting of leaves and brush; a pilot demonstration yard waste composting project for organic components of the waste stream; construction and demolition debris recycling and processing by the private sector; land clearing debris recycling and processing by the private sector; major household appliances recycling; tire recycling; and a two acre clean fill for residential inert debris. For the remaining 40% to 45% of the waste, the Plan contains recommended actions that include landfilling, energy recovery, and solid waste composting associated with alternative legislative/regulatory/legal scenarios for solid waste management on Long Island.

**Potential Environmental Impacts and Mitigation:**

Potential long and short-term generic environmental impacts, and associated mitigation measures, relating to geology, soils, topography, surface water, groundwater, air resources, terrestrial and aquatic ecology, traffic, land use, zoning, community services, demography, cultural and historical resources, visual aspects, noise, and economics have been evaluated and described.
