Most people in the Town of Riverhead will realize a decrease in the actual amount that they will spend out for taxes. We've got a landfill problem. We had guts enough to take on the D.E.C. We had guts enough to spend approximately \$75,000.00 which has saved the Town of Riverhead and the residents of the Town of Riverhead probably to date five, six, seven million dollars. Somebody else would have had to pay for long haulage. That took guts. This budget represents, as far as I'm concerned, the best possible use of public funds in today's economy. It's surplus for a day just like we have in our own household. Any town our size is very foolish not to have a surplus. Problems happen. Unforeseen problems. Litigation and Lord knows that our Ken LaValle and the boys Upstate are going to do to us next. It does take guts to reduce spending. We have not laid a soul off. We've eliminated one job in three years. When someone retires, quits, we ask those sitting alongside to pick up the slack. In some instances we give them a boost in salary to pick up a little more than slack. We are like the Federal Government in many ways, but I truly believe that we have to step backwards slowly and not all at once. With that in mind really I hope that we can do more next year. 5. That any and all landscaped and paved areas shall be regularly maintained in an orderly and professional manner and kept free of weeds and litter; and that any planters, planter boxes, window boxes or other container plantings shall likewise be maintained on a year-round basis;

6. That all utilities shall be constructed underground;

7. Pursuant to Section 108-133I of the **Code of the Town of Riverhead**, the applicant, upon approval of a final site plan by this resolution and prior to the issuance of a building permit, shall post a performance bond or other equivalent security. The performance bond or other security assures the performance of all the conditions of the building permit in accordance with the site plan approval. The Supervisor, upon approval from the Town Attorney as to form, is hereby authorized to accept said performance bond or other security, which shall be filed with the Town Clerk subsequent to approval of the site plan herein. The building permit shall not be issued until the Town Clerk certifies that the performance bond or other security has been filed in the Office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead. Said security shall be in full force and effect for the term of the building permit or any renewal thereof;

8. That a planted buffer of white pine (*Pinus Strobus*), 4'-5' in height, shall be provided along the north side of the fence, where indicated on the site plan approved herein and initialled by a majority of the Town Board; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and is hereby authorized to forward a certified copy of this resolution to Thomas R. Turkel, as agent for NYNEX, the Riverhead Planning Department, Riverhead Building Department, Town Engineer, and Office of the Town Attorney.
